This interdisciplinary project investigates where and why community participation can be successful in the treatment of tuberculosis and other health conditions in rural India. Using insights from economics and sociology, a new theory of solidarity formation is developed to explain how solidarity varies across different types of communities and by network density. The hypotheses will be tested in a unique social laboratory in rural South India with a population of 1.2 million, covering 420 villages (neighborhoods) and 50 sub-castes. A randomized control trial will be conducted to assess the performance of neighborhood and caste members as volunteer DOT (directly observed treatment) providers. TB patient data will be matched with household survey and historical census data on caste networks. Preliminary fieldwork was undertaken January-March 2007, July-August 2008, and June-July 2009.
